

FLBC Travel Team Try-Out Selection Policy:

Revision: September 2015

1. Each participant will be graded by at least 3 qualified evaluators, at a multitude of skill stations. Each qualified evaluator will complete a form to show his/her qualifications and will be reviewed by the Travel Director and the final list will be presented to the Board of Directors for electronic approval. An evaluator may not be the head coach nor may they have a player trying out for that team.
2. All tryouts are closed. No parents, siblings or other spectators are allowed to watch the tryout with the exception of 1 parent/guardian per player for 4th grade boys and 5th grade girls.
3. The scores of all participants will be compiled and participants listed highest to lowest score by the Travel Director. The Travel Director will then share the results with the coach. A hard copy of the results will be distributed to the Board members on team selection night and collected before the end of the meeting.;
4. The participants with the 6 highest scores will automatically be selected to the team (if a coach, for good cause, wants to deviate and not take one or more of the top 6 scorers, he/she must explain the reasons therefore to the Board of Directors and obtain a majority vote of the Board approving any such deviation);
5. The remaining players will be selected by the coach, subject to discussion with the Board of Directors. Any person on the Board with a player up for discussion will be asked to leave the room for the discussion of the team in which their player is trying out for.;
6. The Board of Directors will vote to approve each team roster before participants are notified of the results
7. In the event there are 20+ eligible players registered to tryout, the Board of Directors will attempt to support additional teams to play and practice when there is a valid coach, league and commitment available. An additional tryout may be required.;
8. All scoring information and related discussion are strictly confidential and will not be shared with anyone outside the process without prior written permission of the Board of Directors. Violation of the confidentiality standard may be grounds for dismissal of the offending coach/board member.
